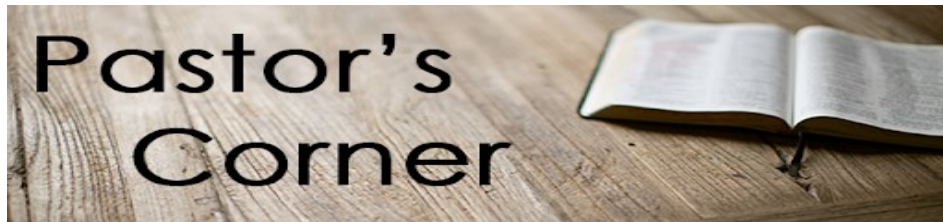

Consistory

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, May 13, 2021– Via Zoom

Consistory Activities— The meeting was held via Zoom. Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Carole Kreimer offered the devotion. The minutes from the April 15th, meeting were reviewed and approved. Ruth Ann Wilson made a motion to approve the minutes and Nancy Sweet 2nd the motion.

New Business—The current COVID protocols were discussed and we can now open to full capacity and no mask is needed if you are outside. We will review the protocols again in June. We also discussed the Christian Home School renting the building for the school year. It would be Mondays & Wednesdays. They would use all the rooms in the Sunday school wing including the Fireside room as well as the Social Hall. They do not need use of the kitchen. They asked if they could keep a small table and a printer here, that should not be a problem stored on the stage.

Pastor's Report— Pastor Amy reported, that it has been a month of meetings for her. She conducted the mission trip meeting via Zoom and also attended the Association Spring Meeting via Zoom. She was able to visit with Phyllis Smith in person.

Treasurer's Report— The financial reports were reviewed.

Church & Ministry Committee—Continuing to work on Amy's Installation service details.

Finance & Stewardship—There was no report.

Property— The consistory would like an update on the refrigerator. LDM performed a deep clean of the inside of the church. The sidewalks need pressure washed and the windows cleaned.

Worship & Fellowship Committee—There was no report.

Christian Education—Rally Day is planned for September 19th at the park.

Mission & Social Action—Soup kitchen will be held on May 16th.

Social Media & Marketing— Tammie and the Website committee are reviewing the proposal and working on what they would like to see on the new webpage. Pastor Amy would like to update the logo, and somehow incorporate the stained glass windows. Tammie has someone who can donate their time for the logo project.

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, June 24, 2021—Via Zoom

Consistory Activities— The meeting was held via Zoom. Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Irene Weddle provided the devotion. Carole Kreimer made a motion to approve the minutes from the May 13th, meeting and Becky Hommer 2nd the motion.

New Business—The current COVID protocols were discussed and it was decided that if you are fully vaccinated, you do not need to wear a mask (except when singing). The current CDC guidelines say that singing is still high risk. Bill would like us to sing but with masks on. We will be putting the bibles and hymnals back in the pews.

Kim Jernigan, the contact for the Christian Home School sent Tammie the current contract for St. Paul's church, Kim said we could use the same contract just change the wording to fit our needs. Irene will ask Chad to review the contract for us. They will use the church on Monday's & Wednesday's September 8th—May 25th. After the school year is finished, they will do a thorough cleaning of the church. The school carries their own liability insurance policy.

Pastor's Report— Pastor Amy reported that the installation service was very nice. The only other meeting she had in June was the Ministerium that was via zoom. General Synod is coming up, she has registered and paid for it out of pocket. Tammie reported there are funds in the budget for this and she will reimburse Pastor Amy. Pastor Amy also applied for a \$30 scholarship towards Synod registration.

Treasurer's Report— The financial reports were reviewed.

Church & Ministry Committee—Pastor Amy's installation was on June 20th and it was a very nice service and reception afterwards.

Finance & Stewardship—There was no report.

Property— The bushes out front were trimmed. The sidewalks need to be power washed and the edging in the flower beds need to be done.. We talked about volunteers and checking the budget for possibly hiring a landscaper. We also talked about finding volunteers or having a landscaping day for everyone to work on the property.

A new refrigerator was purchased for \$3,974.00, we received donations that covered most of the cost. The new fridge is slightly smaller than what we had.
