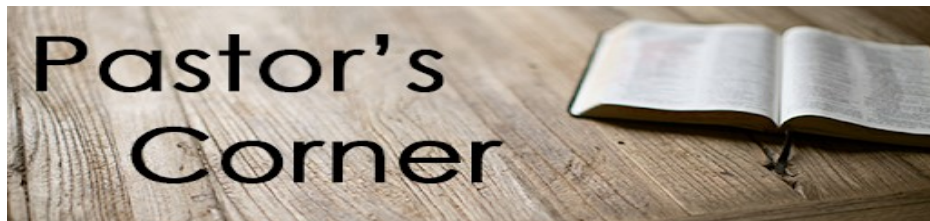

2022 Stewardship Campaign



The formal part of the 2022 stewardship campaign is over – it seemed to go quickly and was relatively painless. We do not have a summary of results of the campaign yet but wanted to take this opportunity to get a “thank you” note into the December newsletter and we are still accepting pledge cards.

This year’s theme was based on Psalms 1:3a, which says “They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season...” which is intended to remind us that if we soak up “God’s word (like the trees next to the stream) we can produce actions and attitudes that honor God. As we have learned from past campaigns, stewardship is an expression of love for God and love for others. Stewardship of time, talent, money, and other resources is a practical way to express love for God and love for others.

Here’s a quote from Arthur Ashe that is appropriate for our stewardship purpose: “Start where you are. Use what you have. Do what you can.” What if we give that approach a try in 2022? Whether with our time, talent, or finances, let’s start with that idea and see what we can accomplish in the next year.

Fall Dinners & Bazaar

I want to express our Heartfelt Thanks to you! Many supported these dinners by coming to help at the Walkersville Fire Hall. Some prayed, others gave monetary support, and some brought requested items such as sugar for the pepper slaw. Some sewed, patted oysters, worked the buffet, baked, cooked food, cleaned floors, washed dishes, or crafted, and many of you shared other talents. We are grateful for each of you! Many tasks were accomplished for a successful bazaar and dinner!

We sent around 419 flyers by bulk mail to our mailing list, while another 100 were notified by e-mail. Ads were also placed in the Frederick newspaper.

On Friday night, we served 439 dinners, and on Saturday 438 dinners were served. 877 dinners were served total, 124 of which were carry outs. We used 100 gallons of oysters, at a cost of \$70.00 a gallon. Tip jars on the tables netted \$288., the craft table had a profit of \$1,146, and the bake table's profit was \$743. Although a few expenses have not been received, we netted approximately \$12,000 on our fall dinners.

We are grateful for the use of the beautiful Walkersville Fire Hall, the fire company members who helped us, local youth from various organizations, and other volunteers from the community.

Linton, Jr. Emergency Shelter, which is the largest and only year-round shelter for the homeless in Frederick.
