Join Pastor Amy for an Ash Wednesday service Live in person here at Glade at 7:00 p.m. on Wednesday, March 2nd.

Ash Wednesday, of course, begins the Lenten season of forty days (excluding Sundays) prior to Easter Sunday. It is a time to reflect on who we are, and who, by God's grace, we might become. Please consider taking advantage of this special worship experience to tend to your spiritual life.







Genesis 3:19 By the sweat of your face you shall eat bread until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return.

In this verse from Genesis, God explains the consequences of their sin to Adam and Eve. These words - remember that you are dust and to dust you shall return – are commonly used during the imposition of ashes on Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent.

Lent is a time when we focus on Christ's journey toward the cross. It is also an opportunity to consider Christ's call to follow in his footsteps. Traditionally, it has been a season of denial, of giving up or letting go, but it is also a time to include spiritual practices, traditionally prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These 40 days allow us to consider how we live, what we have been willing to lay down for our faith, and what we have not.

Holy Week shows us the cost of our sin, and in Easter we see the completion of God's plan for the restoration of all things. Between now and Easter Sunday, we are reminded of the impact of our sins against God and one another. Ash Wednesday reminds us that the journey toward the Cross is one every Christian makes and that our time to make that journey is finite. We are dust and each one of us will return to dust. Every day is a gift and an opportunity to turn away from sin and toward God, to let go of regrets, mistakes, anything that keeps us from following more closely in the footsteps of our Lord.

May we prayerfully enter Lent together,

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, November 18, 2021 Via Zoom

Consistory Activities— The meeting was held via Zoom. Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Carole Kreimer gave the devotional. Carole Kreimer made a motion to approve the minutes from the October meeting and Becky Hommer 2nd the motion.

Pastor's Report— Pastor Amy reported that the confirmation classes are going well. We had our annual All Saints service as well as a baptism in the beginning of the month .

New Business—The current Covid protocols were discussed and everything is working, there are no changes at this time. We will have extra masks on hand for Bills Christmas concert at church as they have to be worn to sing. Tammie presented the 2022 budget and Danny presented the revision to the By-laws to go from 9 to 7 members and from 50% to 2/3rds for a quorum. There will be a Congregation meeting on December 19th to approve the 2022 budget and the revised by-laws. Danny has begun to recruit new consistory members to replace Ruth Ann Wilson, Nancy Sweet & himself. The annual meeting date was set for Sunday, February 13th.

Finance Committee Report— Tammie presented the 2022 budget. The consistory will take the next few days to look at the budget and plan to approve it via email. Danny Ogg sent an email on November 24th asking if everyone had reviewed the budget. Irene Weddle made the motion to accept the budget and by-laws as presented. Becky Hommer seconded the motion. Carole Kreimer, Lisa Frederick & Nancy Sweet all voted to approve the budget.

Property Report—There was no report.

Worship & Fellowship Committee—Bill is planning his Christmas Concert live in person for Wednesday, December 15th at 7:00 p.m. there will not be a Facebook Live version due to copyright with some of the songs that will be played.

Mission & Social Action—We will be working the Soup Kitchen on November 21st.

Glade Guild—The Fall dinner was a success there was a meeting to discuss whether we should hold the spring dinner.

Marketing & Social Media—The website designing is going well and we hope to have the new version up by mid to end December.



Consistory Report Continued

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, December 16, 2021 Via Zoom

Consistory Activities— The meeting was held via Zoom. Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Irene Weddle gave the devotional. The minutes from the November 18th meeting were approved.

New Business—The current Covid protocols were discussed and everything is working. The sign on the door was changed to include that masks were encouraged and required when singing. There will be a congregational meeting on Sunday, December 19th for approval of the 2022 budget, and the changes in the By-Laws. We will go back to using the individual communion cups for Christmas Eve communion and beyond.

Pastor's Report— Pastor Amy reported that confirmation classes continue via zoom. She is lining up speakers from different types of Christianity for the classes, she had a Catholic speaker last month and will have a Quaker speak to the group next. Pastor Amy is also leading an Advent book study. We discussed using battery operated candles for Christmas Eve. She also mentioned that she currently knows of one church that is going back to virtual only services. We will take up a special offering for Kentucky on Christmas Eve this will take place of the Veterans of the Cross. We will send the offering to the local Lions club chapter in the affected areas.

Finance Committee Report— Tammie mentioned that the copier lease will be up in April. Connie & Tammie have interviewed 3 copier companies. Tammie presented the details of the 3 leases to the consistory for their selection. Carol made a motion for the new copier lease with DCA under Tammie's recommendation and Nancy 2nd the motion. All were in favor and the motion passed.

Property—The Frederick East Classical Home School Co-Op would like to continue with us for the next school year. We will get them a new contract in the coming months.

Marketing & Social Media—Tammie sent the link out for the consistory to take a look at the webpage in progress. Nancy suggested not using the word "Proud" we will take a look at rephrasing the words on the opening page.

Minutes of Glade UCC Congregational Meeting Sunday, December 19, 2021


