Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, March 11, 2021 @ 7:00 PM via Zoom

Consistory Activities— Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Lisa Frederick offered the devotion. The minutes from the February 11th, meeting were reviewed and approved. Ruth Ann Wilson has agreed to be Vice President of the Consistory for 2021.

New Business—The current COVID protocols were discussed and everything is still working great, there are no changes at this time. We will be setting up more chairs in the sanctuary for our Easter service.

Pastors Report— Pastor Amy reported that the special services have been fun. We will have an in person service for Maundy Thursday and Easter Sunday. The Good Friday service will be recorded. Jefferson UCC is planning a mission trip to Pipestem State Park August 1st –6th. They have invited Glade to join them. They will be working onsite at the Appalachian Cultural Center. Amy's new Surface Pro 7 was delivered and will be set up next week by Clark Computer.

Finance & Stewardship—We received the guidelines and form to complete to apply for the forgiveness of our loan of the PPP with SBA.

Property— The Kitchen refrigerator is not working, Brooks is working with the repairman on a solution.

Worship & Fellowship Committee—Planning for an in person Easter Service.

Mission & Social Action—We will be preparing bagged lunches for the Soup Kitchen on March 21st.

Social Media & Marketing—Website committee met on Thursday, March 4th. They talked about the two choices for web developers, We Fix Broken Websites (WFBW) or UCC Everywhere. WFBW is highly recommended. Tammie really likes the responses she has gotten from WFBW, the responses from the UCC have been very slow. There was no objection from the consistory to go with WFBW.

Minutes of Glade UCC Annual Meeting Sunday, March 14, 2021 - following worship

Danny Ogg chaired the meeting. On December 20, 2020, the budget was approved by the consistory. There was a motion by Bonnie Ogg to approve the 2021 budget and the motion was 2nd by Adriane Wodey. All congregants who were watching online were encouraged to call in with any questions or comments and their vote. There were no calls received. Motion to approve the 2021 budget was unanimously approved.

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, April 15, 2021 @ 7:00 PM via Zoom

Consistory Activities— Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Pastor Amy gave the devotional. The minutes from the March 11th meeting were reviewed. Nancy Sweet made the motion to approve the minutes and Becky Hommer 2nd the motion.

New Business—The current COVID protocols were discussed and everything is still working great for our normal worship services. We did however discuss our COVID protocols for funerals/memorial services. We recently held a funeral at the church and many more guests turned out than expected. Social distancing could not happen properly. In the future, we need to have written protocols with new guidelines. 50% capacity for Glade is 60 people in the sanctuary. Everyone must wear a mask. We should also have ushers in the future to seat the guests and for now we will need to forego luncheons.

Pastor's Report— We discussed Amy's installation plans. We are hoping for June 20th. Amy was thinking maybe we could have singing outside and then a picnic reception in the park or the Walkersville Bingo Building after the service. Tammie will check availability and pricing.
