## Consistory Report

### Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, July 22, 2021– Via Zoom

**Consistory Activities**— The meeting was held via Zoom. Danny Ogg chaired the meeting and Becky Hommer gave the devotional. The minutes from the June 24th, meeting were reviewed and approved.

**New Business**—Bill is planning on starting the choir on September 26th. Once choir starts we may need to change the layout of worship just a little as a lot of the songs sung will not be able to be videoed on Facebook Live due to copyright issues. The choir will be singing with masks.

**Pastor's Report**— Pastor Amy reported she had a few days of vacation and it felt weird being out on a Sunday. She attended the General Synod online. There was a baptism here at the church on June 27th after worship. Confirmation classes will start in the fall. She would like to do another book study and is looking for recommendations.

**Treasurer's Report**— The financial reports were reviewed.

**Church & Ministry Committee**—There was no report.

**Finance & Stewardship**—Connie is researching credit card payment processors and the committee will discuss those at their next meeting.

**Property**— Tammie received a call from the tenants next door their grandson needs to complete 30 hours of community service. This is a great opportunity for us to have some outside work that needs to be done such as weeding, trimming, pressuring washing etc. We will purchase any materials needed to complete the tasks. The Girl Scouts are scheduled to return in September. Tammie mentioned there are a lot of ramp door keys out that are not being used, she will be putting a message in the bulletin to see if we can have some returned.

**Worship & Fellowship Committee**—World Communion Sunday is the first Sunday in October, we will return to regular communion not using the pre-filled cups. We are looking for lay readers, Tammie will put a notice in the bulletin. There will also be a meeting after church in August to teach others how to record the service.

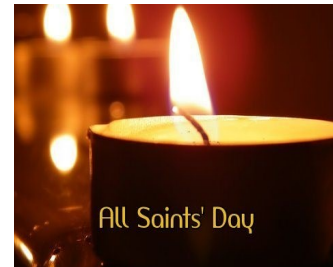

# “Rooted in Love” 2022 Stewardship Campaign



The 2022 stewardship season is around the corner and the theme the United Church of Christ has chosen this year is “Rooted in Love”, based on Psalms 1, verse 3a, which says “They are like trees planted by streams of water, which yield their fruit in its season...” According to the New Living Translation Study Bible, this passage is intended to remind us that if we soak up God’s word (like these trees are soaking up water from the streams)

we can produce actions and attitudes that honor God.

At our Sunday service in the park, Pastor Amy reminded us about the beauty of nature, and the need to take care of it – this is a form of stewardship that honors God. Other types of stewardship that we have talked about in previous campaigns can include faithful attendance at church, caring for your family, friends and neighbors, and the sharing of time, talent, and financial resources with Glade UCC. As we learned in a past campaign, stewardship is an expression of love for God and others.

Who would have thought this would be the second time we would discuss stewardship during the pandemic? I do think the care we have taken (stewardship of our church family) has helped us weather that event. We wore masks when necessary, disinfected the pews after services, and used a lot of hand sanitizer – and we’re not done yet – but our church family keeps showing up, in-person or virtually through our Facebook and YouTube presence.

The author tells the story of the character, Esther, who was known throughout the town of Mitford, for her delicious orange marmalade cake. When she passed away, Father Tim spoke of Esther's **caring** and **giving** qualities at her memorial service. He shared how she "baked and gave cakes (one cake at a time) for the joy of seeing faces light up." He concluded the eulogy with this thought---

We can make a great difference by doing small things graciously."**

When I read that passage, the words seemed to leap off the page, and so I decided to share them with you for your 'inspiration' to be **caring** and **giving** in some small way. Here are some other quotes to spur you on to action:

We're excited to announce that Glade Church's largest fund raiser – The Fall Dinner and Bazaar is **BACK!!** On Friday November 5th, dinners will be served from 4-7 p.m. Saturday November 6th, dinners will be served from 12-5 p.m. Carryout dinners will be available until 4:30 p.m. on Saturday. All dinners are served buffet

style following the Frederick County Health Department and the CDC's guidelines. Masks must be worn while not seated at your table.

We need **YOU** to make the dinners a success! Donations of crafts and baked goods (no cream fillings or butter cream frostings) are needed for the craft and bake table. Purchased frostings or those made with Crisco are allowed. Baked goods to sell will be labeled identifying allergens, such as milk, eggs, shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, soybean, and fish. Rice Krispy treats, popcorn, and chocolate covered pretzels are now allowed. Fudge and caramel are considered to promote rapid growth of bacteria and are not allowed. The craft table can sell seasonally decorated wreaths, knitted, sewn items, hand crafted greeting cards, jewelry, or ornaments, for example.

We also are in need of sugar for the slaw and 9 x 13 cakes for dessert (no butter cream or cream cheese icing, please). Sign up at church in October, or call Cathy Widder (301-898-5558) or Ron Rough (301-639-3834) to volunteer. There is a lot to organize. If you can sign-up early, it helps tremendously!

Remember to include your name with ALL baked goods for the dinner. The Health Department requires us to keep track of the name and product for each contributor of baked goods used/sold during the church dinner.

All volunteers are required to wear a mask, food handlers are required to wear head coverings, such as hairnets or caps, and gloves. No wrist jewelry is to be worn in the kitchen or dining hall, and long hair must be worn up, or tied back securely. Hands should be washed with soap before working.

Slaw makers & meat carvers are needed a few days before the dinners. We set up the fire hall after bingo Thursday night. Lots of opportunities for all! Thanks in advance! We appreciate your help with one of the very best dinners in the area!

## Mission & Social Action Committee



We had a very successful Soup Kitchen on September 19<sup>th</sup>. Many thanks to all the volunteers who provided food and served our guests. The mac & cheese was particularly yummy this time around and there was plenty for all. We filled 30 clamshells with takeout meals for hotel residents and another 40 or so in the dining room on All Saints Street.

November is National Hunger and Homelessness Awareness month. There are observances that go on every year in downtown Frederick that sometimes coincide with our day to serve. They often conclude with a vigil and a meal at the Soup Kitchen served by the participants. This may be the case this year. We are waiting to hear from the Soup Kitchen about whether we'll be needed on November 21 to serve or not. So please mark that date on your calendars, but stay tuned for updates.

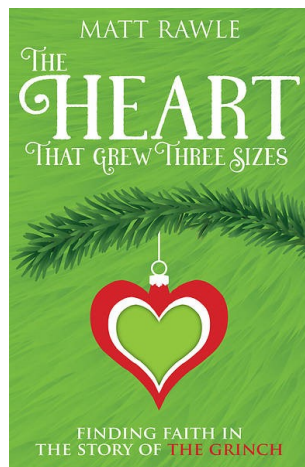
### Sunday School Classes Postponed

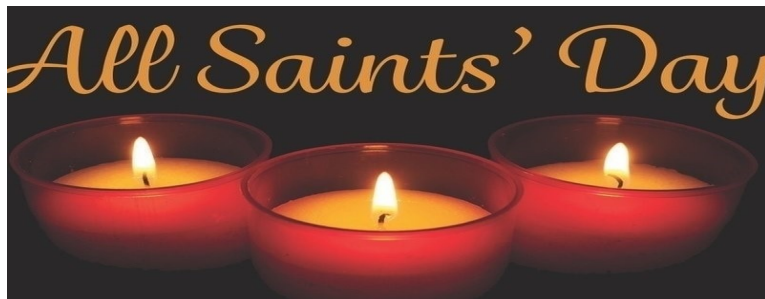
