
**12th Annual Outdoor

I have seen God at work among you as we have tried to walk humbly with God, and I pray for God's continued guidance in all that you do in the coming seasons. I am thankful for the opportunity to have known all of you and will miss you.

**New Business**—The leases for Little David Ministries & the rental house was discussed, Shannon Jordre moved to keep everything in the leases the same as the 2021 leases and Becky Hommer 2nd the motion. Tammie will be working on the lease for the Frederick East Classical Home School Co-Op once this school year is completed.

**New Business**—The lease for the homeschool co-op was reviewed and discussed, we discussed details of whether we should increase the daily rent, or include a clause that allows us to add a surcharge that would cover the increased heating costs anticipated next winter. Tammie will do some research on our heating and electrical expenses over the last few years.


