## A Note from Chad

Hello Glade UCC,

I am excited to be with you as your long-term supply pastor starting October 30<sup>th</sup>, but also am very hopeful that my time will be short, since the church needs a regular ordained minister to lead us, counsel us, visit us when sick or hospitalized.

I know many members know me and my job history etc. and I will expand upon that for newer attendees thru my sermons as opposed to doing a bio here in the Glade Tidings. However, I wanted to give some history on my prior long term preaching assignments.

## **Consistory Report**

### **Minutes of Glade UCC Emergency Consistory Meeting Thursday, July 21, 2022—Via Zoom**

This was an emergency meeting called to discuss Pastor Amy's resignation and how to proceed. Amy had cited her family's health challenges as the primary reason for her resignation, she doesn't feel she's able to give the congregation sufficient attention. Her resignation letter will be mailed to the congregation, and a message was written to insert into the upcoming newsletter.

Amy will be off July 31st and August 7th, but will then work through the end of August. She is still planning to perform Amanda Engel's wedding ceremony on September 10th. Shannon moved and Patty seconded a motion allowing Amy to do the wedding, the vote was unanimous.

We have a relatively recent church profile that we used for our most recent search, which should not require too much updating. We will probably have some retired pastors help transition us to an interim pastor. In the meantime, Bill is planning a hymn sing for Labor Day weekend, Sunday, September 4th, and we will have our service in the park on September 11th.

### **Minutes of Glade UCC Congregational Meeting Sunday, August 14, 2022**

It has been known for some time that the church's heating and cooling systems were in need of significant repair or outright replacement. After much research it has been determined that repair of the system is not cost-effective and that installing a new heat pump-type system would be the best solution to solve the cooling problem and save on expensive oil heat.

The proposal would replace all 8 of the existing cooling units in the sanctuary and social hall with heating/cooling heat pump units. Additional units would be added on the stage and in the kitchen to provide complete coverage. We would maintain the existing oil-fired boiler as a standby backup for use during extremely cold weather. Tri-State Home Services is the company that installed the original AC system, as well as the heat pump system in the education wing. They are an authorized supplier in compliance with Potomac Edison & Empower Maryland's energy efficiency incentive program, which will provide an 80% cost subsidy.

Estimated cost of the system is \$101,365.00 and the Empower Maryland fund will supply \$81,092.00 of this cost. Estimated net cost to Glade is \$20,272.00. The Property Committee suggested authorizing \$25,000.00 in case there were some over-runs or other unexpected expenses.

Shannon Jordre moved, and Bob Watson seconded, to go forward with the project as proposed, and the congregation voted unanimously to go forward. There was a little further discussion after the vote about paying for the project. The UCC national association has a grant program to which we may apply for assistance, but at this time we do have sufficient funds to pay for the project.

The meeting was quickly adjourned.

### Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Thursday, August 18, 2022– Via Zoom

**Consistory Activities**— The meeting was held via Zoom. Irene Weddle called the meeting to order and Bonnie Ogg took over once she arrived to the meeting. The minutes from the June 9<sup>th</sup>, meeting were reviewed and approved.

**New Business**—Chad Weddle has expressed interest in filling the pulpit on a “long-term supply” basis beginning in November and the idea was discussed. Patty moved to invite Chad to be the long-term interim when he becomes available, Shannon modified the motion to say that if a sacrament (such as communion or a baptism) was planned we would seek a UCC ordained pastor to provide that service. Carole seconded, and a vote was taken and passed.

**Pastor’s Report**— Pastor Amy reported that the summer book study went well, and that it was nice to be in-person for the discussion. As this will be her last Consistory meeting, she thanked everyone for their support during her time at Glade. We had some discussion about the processes to seek substitute and interim pastors, as well as a permanent called pastor. There was some discussion about Amy’s going away service on August 28<sup>th</sup>.

**General Business**— There was a brief discussion on the replacement of the air conditioners. We're not sure when that work will be done but expect it to happen before winter. It was noted that the ice machine in the kitchen is also not currently working, Tammie offered to research replacement/repair options.

Discussion moved to the homeschool co-op that uses our facility a couple of days each week. They had several requests:

- 1) They would like to use the back of the sanctuary and a podium for a speech class— we agreed to that but indicated that they should borrow a podium off of the stage in the fellowship hall (and not use the altar).
- 2) They would like to use the kitchen to teach a home-economics-type class - we agreed to that, with the expectation that the kitchen would be supervised and kept clean.
- 3) They would like to have a couple of television in the facility - we did not object to that, but asked them how they plan to secure the televisions while they are not present. We discussed the idea of allowing them to install a lock on one of the classroom doors and putting stuff in that room but left this one to have the details worked out.
- 4) There was some discussion about how to handle their garbage, given that someone needs to walk it around to the front of the building for pickup - we'll work with them on a solution.

Details of the Sept. 11th church in the park are being worked out.

Selecting communion servers on an ad hoc basis when needed has generally been working out okay.

Committee report information was generally covered during the general portion of the meeting if there was activity to discuss/report.

The meeting was adjourned around 9:00 p.m.

We're excited to announce that Glade Church's largest fund raiser – The Fall Dinner is **BACK!!** On Friday November 4th, dinners will be served from 4-7 p.m. Saturday November 5th, dinners will be served from 12-5 p.m. Carryout dinners will be available until 4:30 p.m. on Saturday. All dinners are served buffet style.

We need **YOU** to make the dinners a success! Donations of baked goods (no cream fillings or butter cream frostings) are needed for the bake table. Purchased frostings or those made with Crisco are allowed. Baked goods to sell will be labeled identifying allergens, such as milk, eggs, shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, soybean, and fish. Rice Krispy treats, popcorn, and chocolate covered pretzels are now allowed. Fudge and caramel are considered to promote rapid growth of bacteria and are not allowed. Remember to include your name with ALL baked goods for the dinner. The Health Department requires us to keep track of the name and product for each contributor of baked goods used/sold during the church dinner.

Volunteers are needed to help in the dining hall to help set up / re-set tables, seat patrons, serve drinks, etc. Even if you can only help for a few hours, that is greatly appreciated.

We also are in need of 9 x 13 cakes for dessert (no butter cream or cream cheese icing, please) or monetary donations for supplies. Slaw makers & meat carvers are needed a few days before the dinners.

Food handlers are required to wear head coverings, such as hairnets or caps, and gloves. No wrist jewelry is to be worn in the kitchen or dining hall, and long hair must be worn up, or tied back securely. Hands should be washed with soap before working.

We set up the fire hall after bingo Thursday night and volunteers are needed for those activities. Also volunteers are needed to help close down all activities starting about 4:30 - 5:00 Saturday night.

Sign up at church in October, or call Patty Green (301-898-3629) or Ron Rough (301-639-3834) to volunteer. There is a lot to organize. If you can sign-up early, it helps tremendously! 

## Property

The air conditioning units in the Sanctuary and Social Hall are at the end of their useful life and are failing. The congregation has voted to replace them with Heat Pumps that will cool as well as provide heat. This will allow us to use the oil fired steam boiler to provide only auxiliary heat for the Sanctuary, Social Hall and Kitchen areas. The total cost of installing 10 Mini Split systems is \$101,365. We are receiving an 80% incentive from Potomac Edison through the Empower Maryland Fund of \$81,092. That leaves Glade with a cost of \$20,273 for the new units. If you would like to help with the project, consider making a donation, use the DONATE button on our website or send a check with A/C or Heat Pump on the memo line.



## BIG CHANGES AT THE SOUP KITCHEN NOW THE COMMUNITY TABLE

**Save the Date - Nov. 20, 2022**

The Frederick Soup Kitchen is being rebranded as the Community Table. We will continue to provide our traditional mac & cheese and ham menu the third Sunday of every odd numbered month. We just had our September Soup Kitchen September 18<sup>th</sup>. I wish our cooks, bakers and food providers could be there to see how much our home cooking is appreciated. Nobody doesn't like mac & cheese – especially ours.

The changes are pretty straight forward and will go into effect on September 19th:

- No more disposable trays so we'll be back to running the dishwasher and washing our own plates, glasses, silverware and serving dishes and utensils. **This will require more labor and more volunteers.**
- They are adding an extra half hour so the new hours will be 5-6:30pm. That means we'll have to be there by 4.
- The hotel meals have been stopped.

These are changes we can easily accommodate, and the new name is a definite positive. We appreciate all the support we get from our Glade members. We hope you'll join us for a first-hand experience in the future.



## Sympathy



Glade UCC sends our love and sympathy to the family of Ridgely "Ridge" Cramer, II, 88, of Walkersville, who died on Tuesday, September 6, 2022 at Frederick Health Hospital. He was the husband of the late Joyce Cramer, who died in 2006. They were married for 26 years at the time of her passing.

Born on November 7, 1933, in Frederick, MD, he was the son of the late Frank R. Cramer and Ellis J. (Mercer) Cramer. He was the last of his immediate family.

He graduated from Walkersville High School and enlisted in the U. S. Marine Corps serving as a proud Marine from 1953 to 1957. Ridge worked for the Phillips 66 Fuel Oil Company after his enlistment and settling down in Walkersville in 1958. He became an Insurance Adjuster in the early 1970's and worked for Selected Risks, Erie Insurance and the Gay and Taylor Company in Towson in various positions. He retired in 1999. He also worked at Montgomery Ward in Annapolis.

He was an active member for the Walkersville Volunteer Fire Company and Walkersville Volunteer Rescue Company. He was a weekly worker at the joint Bingo Fund Raiser and sold holder tickets at many Rescue Company events. His tenure with the fire company started in 1958. He held numerous positions at the fire company including engine driver, Vice-President 1963-1965, Board of Director 1967, 2014-2015. He was instrumental in starting the County Fire Police Association in 1969. He was Captain of the Marching Unit from 1963 to 1977.


Ridge was an active community leader and served as a Walkersville Town Commissioner from 1972-1978 and also served as an election judge. He was the first President of the Kiwanis Club of Walkersville which was organized in 1973. Additionally, he was an active member of the Shangri-La Detachment of the Marine Corp League of Frederick; an active member of the Woodsboro American Legion; and was President of the Glade Town Condo Association for over a decade serving from 2007-2019.

He is survived by four sons, William Ridgely "Topper" Cramer and wife, Cindy of Walkersville, Jordan Cramer of Houston, TX, Marc Cramer and wife, Brittany, of York, PA, and Bryan Conley of Weatherford, TX; a daughter, Courtney Vogenitz and husband, Matt, of Stafford, VA; 12 grandchildren; two great-grandchildren; and a sister-in-law, Eileen Cramer of Walkersville.

He was predeceased by his former wife, Betty Jean Wise in 1990; two sisters, Josephine Gilbert and Shirley Stull; and a brother, Richard Cramer.

Many times he was the one comforting us, with what he was dealing with, never showing the true fight he was enduring. He was blessed with a wonderful support group. Fortunately, he was able to continue living at home with his wife, Dawn a warrior herself being his caretaker to the end.
