Consistory Report

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Tuesday, January 10, 2023 Via Zoom

The meeting was held via Zoom. Irene Weddle chaired the meeting and Patty Green gave the devotional. The minutes from the December 13, 2022, meeting were approved, Nancy Sweet made the motion to approve the minutes and Patty Green 2nd the motion.

There was discussion of the new contractor for snow plowing—Grant Zimmerman with Grant's Honest Lawn Care at a rate of \$125 per hour to plow and \$70 per hour to shovel. Lorijean made the motion to approve and Patty Green 2nd the motion.

The Annual meeting will occur on February 12, 2023, after worship with the snow date being February 19, 2023.

Ash Wednesday is on February 22nd, Chad will give an option to the congregation for a 12:00 p.m., 3:00 p.m. or 5:00 p.m. service due to Chad having a town meeting that evening at 7:00 p.m.

Tammie reported that Glade received the Trinity Trust Grant in the amount of \$5,000. We will receive our first installment of \$1,250 at the end of the first quarter. Thanks to Adriane Wodey & Brooks Widder for preparing the grant. We can reapply for the grant for up to 2 more years.

Tammie offered to make Consistory binders for any new member who does not have one and would like one. She will be looking into Google Docs as an option in the future.

Walkersville UMC will hold a Spring Oyster, Turkey & Ham dinner on March 24th & 25th for the first time at the Walkersville Fire Hall. Glade will assist with

manpower as they assisted us at our Fall dinner.

Chad announced he would be away Sunday February 26th & Sunday, March 5th. On February 26th Bill will host a hymn sing, we are currently looking for a guest pastor to fill in for Chad on Sunday, March 5th.

Consistory Report Continued

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Tuesday, February 20, 2023 Via Zoom

The meeting was held via Zoom. Bonnie Ogg chaired the meeting and Patty Green gave the devotion. The minutes from the January 10, 2023, meeting were approved, Shannon Jordre made the motion to approve the minutes and Irene Weddle 2nd the motion.

The meeting began with a discussion of worship plans for Lent/Easter. Chad plans to be available 12:00-12:30 p.m. & 5:00-5:30 p.m. in the sanctuary on Ash Wednesday for imposition of ashes to anyone interested.

Chad is planning to provide communion during our Maundy Thursday service (service time TBD, but likely 7:00 or 7:30 p.m.). He is also planning for communion during our Easter worship. We will need 3 communion trays, 4 servers, and Chad will serve the choir on Easter Sunday.

We discussed starting to plan a list of ushers and greeters, so far, the offering counters have been collecting the offering, and this seems to work well as they are scheduled to already be in church that day.

The Methodist church will be holding their spring dinner at the fire hall on March 24th & 25th, following the same menu and plans we use. They are hopeful we can supply some volunteers to help. We will have a sign-up sheet in the back of the church soon.

The search committee has been waiting to get organized, but wondering if it would be appropriate to ask Pastor when she is our guest pastor on March 5th if she would consider coming back part-time. We discussed briefly and decided there was no harm in asking—we just don't want to pressure her.

There was some discussion about advertising in the Woodsboro/ Walkersville Times with our schedule for Lent and Easter, as well as for Walkersville Day. Tammie was going to talk to the publisher to mock up some ads.

Regarding the building, we discussed the leaks in the greenhouse roof, carpeting in the Fireside Room, and damaged ceiling tiles in the social hall. Bonnie has been talking to Bob and Brooks about the fixes. We're having good luck with the new HVAC system, we are still making adjustments, but getting rather good at efficiency. Were still running the old boiler, to provide some heat in the basement, and to supplement the HVAC when it is really cold out.
