## 2024 Stewardship Campaign



The 2024 stewardship campaign will begin in a few weeks and the theme this year is “Because of You, Our Church Changes Lives” to help remind us there is a connection between our generosity and the ministry and mission of our congregation.

We often associate stewardship with financial donations, and although funding the church is important, so is the time and talent that members of the church family share with the congregation and community. Stewardship is an expression of love for God and others, and one way we express love for God is by loving others. An excellent example of this was the group of Glade members and friends who

supplied and served food for the Community Table on September 17<sup>th</sup>.

Glade is going through a period of transition as we are between called pastors and adjusting to post-pandemic operations. Although we have a slightly smaller weekly attendance than in the past, our congregation is faithful and engaged. The building is in good shape and busy with church and community activities. As we move farther into the Fall season, we would like you to consider how you can help maintain this forward momentum, through your financial contributions, as well as your time, talents and prayers -- the stewardship campaign reminds us that we can all give something. Remember this quote from Archbishop Desmond Tutu from our campaign a few years ago: “Do your little bit of good where you are. It is those little bits of good put together that overwhelm the world.”

The formal campaign will run later this fall, but we wanted to make everyone aware of our plans and get you thinking about how you could participate. ## **Consistory Report**

### **Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Tuesday, August 15, 2023—Via Zoom**

Bonnie Ogg opened the meeting and Nancy Sweet supplied the devotion. Lorie Jean Turner moved to accept the minutes from June's meeting, and Irene Weddle seconded, and all voted in favor.

Chad started with the pastor's report. He appreciated Sunday, July 30th off. He's working on an idea about getting folks to explain how they arrived at Glade UCC and working on a way to present them. He also mentioned getting a new sign for the front office door with the current office hours, as well as a delivery sign for the sanctuary doors. (Packages are always getting left there when they need to be dropped off at the office door.) He would also like to hold a Fall breakfast and is looking at dates and details. We also discussed the idea of doing a member recognition celebration in the Fall—a potluck luncheon or breakfast event in October or November.

Tammie reported that she found some dead bats inside the church building, along with lots of droppings on the front sanctuary porch, we believe they are nesting in the ceiling. Bonnie offered to find someone to come and remove them and do the clean up.

Worship in the park will occur Sunday, September 10, 2023. The Church will supply hot dogs, buns, paper goods and bottled water. People are asked to bring a potluck dish to share.

Shannon asked about doing a stewardship campaign in October or November, as we've done the last several years. We talked about concluding a stewardship campaign on November 19th, possibly with some kind of fellowship event (maybe the recognition celebration mentioned above).

Advent starts on December 3rd and Christkindlmarket will happen on December 2nd. We will need to decorate the church on Sunday, November 26th following worship. We talked about scheduling guest pastors for a couple weeks at the end of the year, and Bill will have a hymn sing on December 31st.

Nancy asked how often the food bank basket is emptied and who takes the food donations to the food bank, run by Glade Valley Community Services.

The carpet cleaning has occurred, and the carpets look good. Additionally, someone has trimmed the weeds in the parking lot. The homeschoolers come back to school after Labor Day.

We serve again at the Community Table (formerly the Soup Kitchen) on September 17th, and plans are looking good. The caregiver ministry has been active. The Fall church dinner will take place November 3-4, 2023, and planning is underway. The Guild will meeting after church on Sunday, September 17th.

Chad suggested putting an ad in the Walkersville-Woodsboro Times each month for the rest of the year containing our schedule and some other basic information—he offered to pay for it.

Bonnie adjourned the meeting and Chad closed the meeting with a prayer.

# Glade Church Fall Dinner

We're excited to announce that Glade Church's largest fund raiser – The Fall Dinner is **BACK!!** On Friday November 3<sup>rd</sup>, dinners will be served from 4-7 p.m. Saturday November 4<sup>th</sup>, dinners will be served from 12-5 p.m. Carryout dinners will be available until 4:30 p.m. on Saturday. All dinners are served buffet style.

We need **YOU** to make the dinners a success! Donations of baked goods (no cream fillings or butter cream frostings) are needed for the bake table. Purchased frostings or those made with Crisco are allowed. Baked goods to sell will be labeled identifying allergens, such as milk, eggs, shellfish, tree nuts, peanuts, wheat, soybean, and fish. Rice Krispy treats, popcorn, and chocolate covered pretzels are now allowed. Fudge and caramel are considered to promote rapid growth of bacteria and are not allowed. Remember to include your name with ALL baked goods for the dinner. The Health Department requires us to keep track of the name and product for each contributor of baked goods used/sold during the church dinner.

Volunteers are needed to help in the dining hall to help set up / re-set tables, seat patrons, serve drinks, etc. Even if you can only help for a few hours, that is greatly appreciated.

We also are in need of 9 x 13 cakes for dessert (no butter cream or cream cheese icing, please) or monetary donations for supplies. Slaw makers & meat carvers are needed a few days before the dinners.

Food handlers are required to wear head coverings, such as hairnets or caps, and gloves. No wrist jewelry is to be worn in the kitchen or dining hall, and long hair must be worn up, or tied back securely. Hands should be washed with soap before working.

We set up the fire hall after bingo Thursday night and volunteers are needed for those activities. Also volunteers are needed to help close down all activities starting about 4:30 - 5:00 Saturday night.

Sign up at church in October, or call Patty Green (301-898-3629) or Ron Rough (301-639-3834) to volunteer. There is a lot to organize. If you can sign-up early, it helps tremendously! Lots of opportunities for all! Thanks in advance! We appreciate your help with one of the very best dinners in the area!

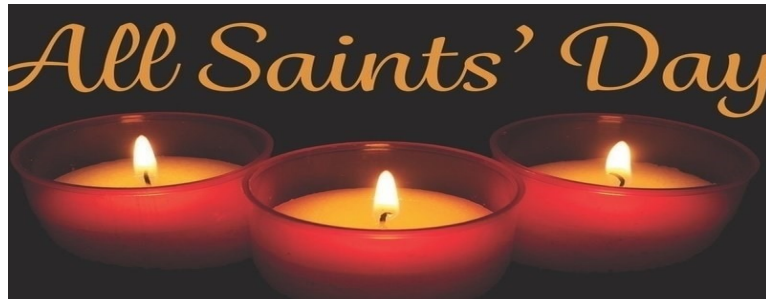

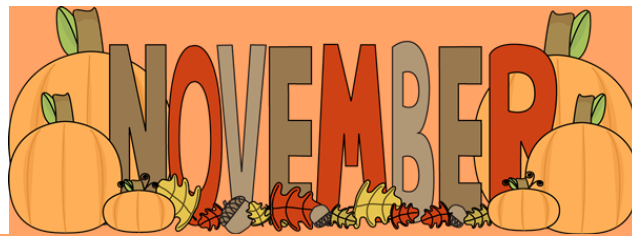
