It feels like just yesterday we were having our music-inspired Christmas Eve service, and now I am writing about Ash Wednesday and Lent. Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th, with the first Sunday of Lent following on February 18th. On Ash Wednesday, February 14th, the church will be open for the imposition of ashes from 7:30 to 8:00 pm.

Lent is a period of 40-days where we are asked to set aside specific time each day to reflect on Christ's journey toward the cross. As I often mention in service, we should be in "relationship" with God not just one hour each Sunday. I encourage you to try and dedicate a time each day during Lent for prayer, reflection, and being in a relationship with the one who created, sustains, and loves us so much that we have the promise of everlasting life based on that love.



Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Tuesday, November 14, 2023 Via Zoom

The meeting was held via Zoom. Bonnie Ogg opened the meeting and Patty Green offering the devotion. Next month's consistory meeting will be an in-person meeting on Sunday, December 10, 2023, following worship, with a Zoom option for anyone unable to attend in person. Shannon Jordre moved to accept the October meeting minutes, and Irene Weddle seconded, and all members voted in favor.

Chad presented his Pastor's Report, emphasizing the busy schedule for November and December. The discussions centered on November's remaining activities and plans for Christmas preparations. Specific dates were outlined for key events, such as decorating the sanctuary on November 26th, Christkindlmarket on December 2nd the Christmas concert on December 20th, and the schedule for our Christmas Eve services and the New Year's Eve hymn sing.

Bonnie Ogg and Lorijean Turner provided updates on the ongoing communication with the Catoctin Association regarding Chad's licensure, ensuring a smooth continuation of his pastoral services within the congregation.

Patty reported on the Fall dinner, sharing that a total of 902 meals were served, including 91 carryout meals, resulting in a profit of approximately \$15,000. Attendees provided positive feedback, expressing gratitude for the successful event.

Tammie shared progress on various fronts, including the installation of the front security cameras and the back cameras would also be installed by Brooks when his schedule and weather allowed. Additionally, plans for snow removal arrangements were discussed, with Tammie & Bonnie aiming to finalize arrangements for potential snowfall, following the previous year's lack of need for such services. Tammie is planning to talk with the same person that Bonnie had lined up for last year. Tammie also addressed a recent plumbing issue in the building, which has been resolved. She mentioned plans to take time off between Christmas and New Year's, ensuring her tasks are completed in advance.

An upcoming congregational meeting was planned for December 17th to finalize the adoption of the 2024 budget and possibly consider bylaw changes or other business matters. Tammie presented the proposed 2024 budget to the consistory, which closely resembles budgets from previous years. Nancy moved to approve the proposed budget, seconded by Lorijean, and the motion was unanimously approved.

The meeting was adjourned and Chad closed with a prayer.

Consistory Report Continued

Minutes of Glade UCC Consistory Meeting Sunday December 10, 2023 In Person

The meeting was held in person after worship. Bonnie Ogg chaired the meeting Irene Weddle moved to accept the minutes from the November 14th meeting and Patty Green seconded, all voted in favor.

Chad offered his Pastor's report, highlighting the planning and execution of December's holiday activities, including the details for the upcoming Christmas Eve service. He also updated the Consistory on the ongoing process of renewing his ministerium license with the Catoctin Association and outlined plans for a new member installation, to be scheduled this spring.

We welcomed Cathy Widder and Carole Kreimer as incoming Consistory members, expressing gratitude to departing members Irene Weddle and Becky Hommer. Officers were nominated for 2024, with Bonnie Ogg nominated for President, Lorijean Turner for Vice-President, and Shannon Jordre for Secretary. The elections for new members and officers are scheduled for the upcoming Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 17th.

Tammie provided updates on snow removal arrangements, having discussions with Grant Zimmerman, and addressed the school's inquiries about next year's rent. The Consistory decided on a slight increase in rental fees, raising them by \$5/day to \$130/day, reflecting the rising costs of maintenance and utilities. A motion by Shannon, seconded by Lorijean, was unanimously approved.

The Consistory engaged in a detailed discussion on potential updates to the church's articles of incorporation, constitution, and by-laws. Lorijean proposed prioritizing changes, including adjusting the Consistory size to 7 members, modifying quorum requirements, and consolidating the annual congregational meeting to December. The motion was made by Lorijean, seconded by Patty, and unanimously approved.

Shannon motioned to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Irene, with all members voting in favor. Chad closed the meeting with a prayer.



Congregation Meeting Minutes

The Glade UCC Annual Congregational Meeting took place on Sunday, December 17, 2023, immediately following the church service. Bonnie Ogg called the meeting to order. The purpose of the meeting was to approve the 2024 budget and elect new Consistory members who will begin serving in January 2024.

Shannon Jordre moved, and Lorijean Turner seconded, to adopt the 2024 budget as presented, and the motion carried with no objections. Lorijean moved, and Nancy Sweet seconded, to accept the new Consistory members and slate of officers (Bonnie as President, Lorijean as Vice President, and Shannon as Secretary), with the motion carrying without objections.

Changes to the church Constitution were addressed individually. Shannon moved and Lorijean seconded to change the quorum for congregational meetings from 15% to 10%, with the motion carrying without objections. Nancy Sweet moved and Kim Stevens seconded to hold one Annual Congregational Business meeting in December each year, and the motion carried without objections. Shannon moved and Lorijean seconded to change the property disposition if the church were to dissolve, and after a brief discussion, the motion carried.

Lisa Jordre moved to adjourn, Patty Green seconded, and the meeting concluded.
